

#### Barred Owl

When photographing wild life, rarely do my subjects pose. The exception took place while we were visiting my wife's family who live on a farm in Middle Tenn. near Clifton. One early morning, with camera in hand, I went out looking for birds and as I was hiking, I noticed a Barred Owl standing along side the road. I took a few pictures but they weren't very interesting. I began to move toward the bird and noticed that it didn't move which led me to think that it had been injured. As I got closer, it flew up over my head and landed in a nearby tree at about head high. I moved in close and began "shooting" and continued for nearly ten minutes while the Owl patiently sat there and posed. As I turned to leave, it flew away.

## U Bein Bridge



The U Bein Bridge is the longest teak wood bridge in the world, located near Amarapura in the Mandalay Division of Myanmar (Burma) on the Taungthaman lakeThe bridge, popular among visitors to this intriguing Southeast Asian nation, stretches nearly 3/4 of a mile across the Taungthaman lake. Built in 1847, most of the nearly 1,000 original teak posts remain.

The bridge leads to the Kyauktawgyi Pagoda. Monks cross back and forth daily to receive their food which is distributed near the Pagoda.

My wife and I arrived in the U Bein area about an hour before sunset and rented a canoe shaped boat with an oarsman who propelled us around the area of the bridge. As the sun began to sink I began to wonder if we were going to be able to get back to the area I had picked to "shoot" the sunset. But at the right moment the oarsman brought the boat around to the right spot and we got these shots.

This is the first time we have hung a show at SunTrust, so members are urged to participate. Hanging a show in this gallery is available only for groups, not for individuals.

The hanging system used is regular picture hooks. Framed images should have hanging wire installed before delivery to the space.

#### December 2013

Exhibit dates: Dec. 6 to Dec. 31.

There will be an opening reception to coincide with First Friday (Dec. 6).

This gallery has good lighting and good traffic on First Fridays. Members are encouraged to participate in this show: we've had a well-received show in this space for many years. The hanging system used in this gallery requires that framed images must have screw eyes 1" from the top on each upright to hang properly.

Each member is strongly encouraged to participate in each exhibition by showing one or more pieces of work. Also, each member is encouraged to develop a list of friends & acquaintances to whom they send an email (or snail mail) invitation / notice of each of the new exhibits. Venues allow us to use their space as a means to encourage new visitors. It is to our mutual ADVANTAGE TO INCREASE ATTENDANCE AT EXHIBITS.


